The Faculty of Dentistry at the University of Jordan, in collaboration with the Jordanian Hashemite Fund for Human Development (JOHUD) and Zain Jordan, has launched a week-long awareness campaign and free dental check-ups for students. The initiative aims to enhance student health and provide preventive and treatment services on campus.

The campaign offers a wide range of dental services, including removable dentures, fillings, tooth extractions, root canal treatments, fixed prosthetics, and gum care, provided at the student clinics of the University of Jordan Hospital under the supervision of specialized dental professionals.

Additionally, mobile clinics from JOHUD and Zain are stationed بالقرب من Deanship of Student Affairs, ensuring easy access to free screenings for all students across campus.

The campaign runs daily from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, aiming to raise oral health awareness, encourage early detection of dental issues, and promote preventive care practices.

- Free Dental Treatments for Elderly in Care Homes for the Fourth Consecutive Year

As part of its ongoing commitment to community service, the Faculty of Dentistry at the University of Jordan has launched, for the fourth consecutive year, an initiative providing free dental treatments for elderly residents in care homes.

The initiative is carried out in collaboration with clinical master's students in fixed and removable prosthodontics programs, under the supervision of Dr. Rasha Al-Amoush. Through home care visits, a mobile dental clinic supported by Zain is dispatched to care homes to provide essential dental prosthetic treatments for seniors.

Implemented in line with international medical standards, the campaign is conducted in partnership with the Jordanian Hashemite Fund for Human Development (JOHUD) and Zain Jordan, as part of ongoing collaborations for the fourth year in a row. Treatments, including dental prosthetics and necessary preparatory procedures, are delivered under the direct supervision of faculty members.

This initiative reflects the Faculty's dedication to enhancing students' clinical skills while serving vulnerable communities, reinforcing the University's broader mission of social responsibility and community engagement.

As part of their ongoing efforts to enhance access to healthcare, Zain Jordan and the University of Jordan, in collaboration with the Jordanian Hashemite Fund for Human Development (JOHUD), have announced the renewal of their partnership agreement to continue delivering free healthcare services through various programs and initiatives.

Under the agreement, Zain will continue to support the University by deploying its free mobile clinic in medical campaigns and open health days held on campus, targeting university students as well as elderly communities through visits to care homes. These initiatives provide comprehensive healthcare and dental services to those in need.

The renewed partnership builds on a strong track record of impactful initiatives, including free medical days and outreach visits that have benefited hundreds of patients. On campus, the mobile clinic has provided free screenings and treatments to 196 students, including dental check-ups, fillings, root canal treatments, gum care, and fixed prosthetics, in collaboration with the Faculty of Dentistry.

Additionally, a series of field visits were conducted to Wadi Al-Shita Elderly Care Center, where residents received essential medical and dental care. These services were delivered with the participation of postgraduate students in prosthodontics, offering treatments such as non-surgical extractions, scaling, teeth cleaning, and preparation for full dentures.

Zain Jordan highlighted that this partnership aligns with its commitment to supporting the health sector in Jordan and expanding access to quality healthcare services across the Kingdom. The company also expressed pride in its long-standing collaboration with the University of Jordan, emphasizing its continued dedication to serving communities in need.

Since its launch in 2002, Zain's mobile clinic has served over 260,000 beneficiaries, providing comprehensive free healthcare services, including disease screening, chronic illness follow-up, dental care, and child health services, in coordination with the Ministry of Health and local community organizations.

This initiative also supports the UN Sustainable Development Goal 3: Good Health and Well-being, reflecting Zain's broader commitment to sustainable development and community impact.

- University of Jordan Dentistry Students Participate in “Sehtak Beldonya 5” Health Day

As part of its commitment to community engagement and health awareness, the Faculty of Dentistry at the University of Jordan participated in the “Sehtak Beldonya 5” Health Day, hosted by the Princess Sumaya University for Technology in collaboration with the Hashemite Charity Organization.

The event featured free medical consultations, screenings, and awareness activities tailored for university students. The Faculty of Dentistry was represented by 12 fifth-year students, an intern dentist, and a resident in oral diseases, under the supervision of faculty members.

During the event, the team provided oral health education, including awareness on oral diseases and oral cancer, and conducted free clinical examinations for students and staff.

More than 70 beneficiaries received health services, while 33 cases were referred to the University of Jordan Hospital dental clinics for further free treatment.

This participation reflects the Faculty’s ongoing efforts to support community initiatives, promote preventive care, and encourage early detection and treatment.

- Awareness Day for Epidermolysis Bullosa Patients at the University of Jordan Hospital

The Dentistry Department at the University of Jordan Hospital organized an awareness day for patients with Epidermolysis Bullosa (EB), under the supervision of Prof. Yazan Hassona, Consultant in Special Care Dentistry, in collaboration with the Wings of Butterflies Foundation and DEBRA Organization.

Outreach Projects 2024 & 2025 **at The University of Jordan**

The initiative aimed to raise awareness among patients and their families about the importance of oral health and dental care for individuals living with EB.

Prof. Hassona explained that EB, also known as “Butterfly Disease,” is a rare, inherited, non-contagious condition characterized by fragile skin and blistering, including inside the mouth. This can lead to painful ulcers, making eating, swallowing, and maintaining oral hygiene particularly challenging. He emphasized the importance of early and consistent oral care to prevent complications.

He also noted that while there is currently no definitive cure, supportive treatments can help manage the condition and improve patients’ quality of life. Ongoing global research offers hope for future breakthroughs.

The hospital’s Special Care Dentistry Clinic provides tailored treatment plans using specialized tools and precautions to ensure safe and effective care for these patients.

The event included a scientific workshop for dental residents and students on managing and diagnosing oral conditions in EB patients, as well as an interactive session for patients and caregivers. Topics covered included proper oral hygiene practices, selecting suitable toothbrushes and toothpaste, maintaining oral moisture, staying hydrated, and adopting appropriate nutrition while avoiding hard foods.

Dermatology specialists also provided guidance on wound care and preventing infections, and patients received oral examinations and personalized recommendations.

This initiative reflects the hospital’s commitment to patient-centered care, education, and supporting individuals with special healthcare needs.

- Dental Evidence-Based Learning (DEBL) Club at the University of Jordan

The Dental Evidence-Based Learning (DEBL) Club, founded by Dr. Marwa Al-Nsour, Assistant Professor at the University of Jordan's Faculty of Dentistry, serves fourth- and fifth-year dental students. The club aims to enhance students' clinical decision-making skills through discussions of real cases supported by evidence-based research.

DEBL promotes active learning and collaboration, with guidance from faculty and residents across multiple specialties, including orthodontics, conservative dentistry, endodontics, and oral medicine. So far, the club has held ten sessions covering key topics such as caries diagnosis and management, failed endodontic treatments, tooth extraction complications, managing patients with systemic conditions, emergency dental trauma, post-trauma complications, pulp disease diagnosis and treatment, oral lesion identification, dental and jaw infections, and tooth discoloration management.

In partnership with Zain, sessions are held at Zinc in Hussein Business Park every Saturday, providing students with practical insights and skills to confidently handle complex cases. Sessions will resume after midterm exams.

- Scientific Field Visit to Samra Power Plant

Under the supervision of Dr. Mohammad Al-Mashaqbeh

The School of Engineering at the University of Jordan organized an outreach activity titled “Scientific Field Visit to Samra Power Plant” in collaboration with IEEE Robotics and Automation Society. The visit included the participation of engineering students as part of enhancing the practical aspect of their academic courses.

The visit began with an introductory lecture that addressed the status of the power generation sector in Jordan, highlighting the role and importance of Samra Electric Power Company within the national energy system. This was followed by a field tour inside the plant’s facilities.

During the tour, students were introduced to the operation of sensors, measurement systems, and control systems used to monitor operational variables such as pressure, temperature, and flow rates. They also explored protection and monitoring systems that ensure efficiency, safety, and system stability.

This initiative aimed to bridge the gap between theoretical knowledge and practical industrial applications, helping students broaden their understanding and prepare for real-world engineering environments.

The University of Jordan highlighted a public awareness initiative through a television interview featuring Prof. Dr. Radwan Al-Weshah, an international expert in water engineering.

To address this issue, he stressed the importance of implementing effective solutions such as improving water treatment technologies, increasing irrigation efficiency, enhancing water storage systems, and investing in seawater desalination. He also highlighted the need to promote water conservation practices at both individual and institutional levels.

The visit targeted fourth- and fifth-year students enrolled in the “Industrial Automation” and “Industrial Automation Lab” courses. It was organized by the department’s academic committee and aimed to provide students with practical exposure to automation technologies used in real production lines.

- HRH Prince El Hassan bin Talal Patronizes Launch of Nexus Conference at the University of Jordan

Under the patronage of HRH Prince El Hassan bin Talal, the University of Jordan, in collaboration with GIZ (German Agency for International Cooperation), launched the Third Nexus Conference on Energy, Water, Food, and Environment.

In his opening remarks, Prince El Hassan emphasized the importance of engaging stakeholders and local communities in addressing the interconnected challenges of water, energy, food, and ecosystems to foster citizenship and a sense of belonging through action.

Highlighting global challenges, he noted that 40% of the world's population faces water scarcity, and by 2040, one in four children will live in areas with severe water shortages. He also stressed that food production must increase by 70% by 2050 to meet global demand while minimizing environmental impacts.

The conference underscored the urgent need for integrated policies that address the natural interlinkages between water, energy, food, and environmental systems. Prince El Hassan also called for the establishment of a regional water and energy community to strengthen cooperation across the Levant.

Acting President of the University of Jordan, Dr. Ashraf Abu Karaki, reaffirmed the university's commitment to developing a comprehensive strategic vision that promotes sustainability and ensures long-term resource management

The students provided a simplified explanation about cancer, highlighting the "Jordan Challenges Cancer" campaign in collaboration with the King Hussein Cancer Center, which aims to raise awareness in the local community about the importance of prevention, mental health care, and the necessity of regular early screening tests that save lives. They also emphasized the importance of combating all forms of smoking, as it is linked to about 13 types of cancer, most notably colon and rectal cancer.

This awareness booth, under the slogan "Together for Better Digestive Health," will continue throughout March, with sessions held twice a week. It aims to raise awareness about colon cancer and the essential screenings that help in its early detection, such as a colonoscopy every 10 years after the age of 50 or a fecal occult blood test, which is recommended annually after the age of 50. The booth also distributed brochures to educate the public on these matters.

The students stressed the need for a national program for colon cancer to detect people diagnosed at an early stage, even before symptoms appear, which increases the chances of successful treatment. Additionally, they highlighted the importance of detecting and removing polyps in the colon to prevent.

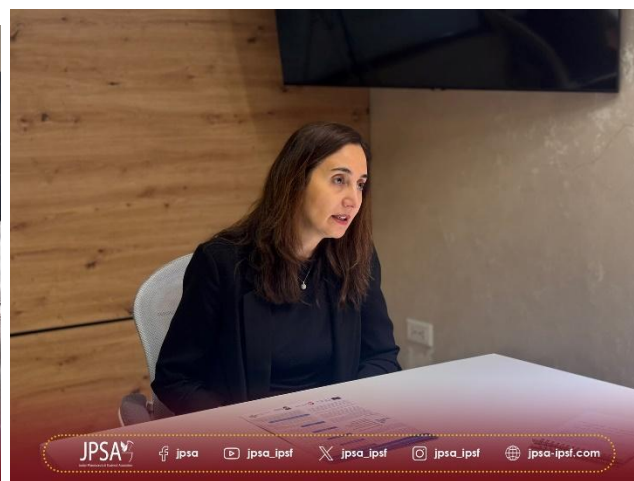

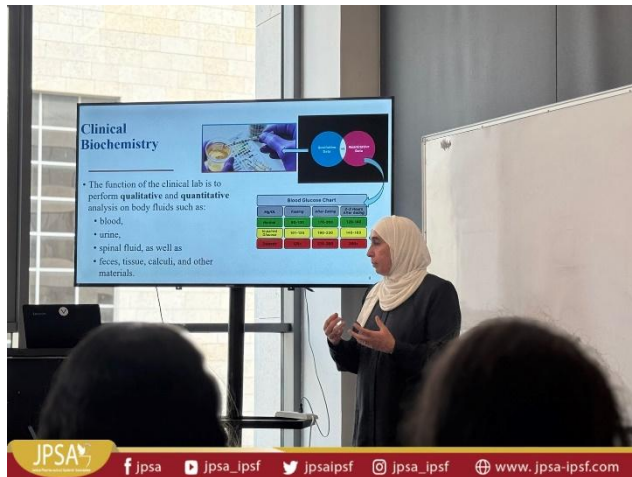

The team included six students, three from the University of Jordan—Abdulrahman Al-Maryan (Mechatronics Engineering), Mohammad Al-Najjar (Artificial Intelligence), and Firas Obeid (Mechanical Engineering)—alongside peers from other Jordanian universities. OptiGuide is an innovative visual-assistive tool consisting of an AI-powered mobile application and two tactical wristbands. The system guides visually impaired users by generating directional vibrations to indicate safe paths. The students applied their academic knowledge and benefited from the guidance of experienced faculty members, including Dr. Mousa Al-Yaman from the School of Engineering and Dr. Mousa Al-Akhras from the King Abdullah II School of Information Technology. Their victory qualifies OptiGuide to represent Orange Jordan in the regional competition against other winning teams from different countries. The Orange Summer Challenge, held for the second time, involved over 300 students from various Jordanian universities, from which 30 students were selected and divided into five teams to develop and

Their winning project, Smart Skin App, is an application specialized in detecting skin cancer tumors using artificial intelligence combined with integrated medical diagnostics. Patients create personal accounts, capture images of affected areas, and submit them through digital tickets. The AI model analyzes the images, predicts potential malignancy, and provides a confidence score. Tickets are automatically sorted by confidence and lesion type for physician review, enabling doctors to assess AI results and patient responses, and schedule clinical follow-ups. The app effectively combines AI and medical expertise to accelerate early skin cancer detection and support accurate clinical decisions, representing a promising model in digital health technology.

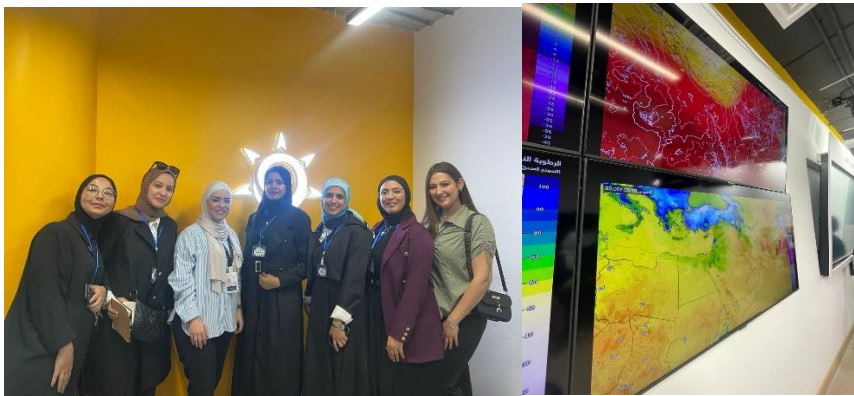

During the launch, the student team consisting of Malak Al-Jbouri, Tala Abu Khait, Lara Bani Malham, Sadeel Bani Younes, Asil Al-Lababidi, and Fares Yacoub was honored and presented their work, and student Nayel Al-Naimat (Boumsee) performed a sports segment that received enthusiastic attention from the audience. The event was attended by the Dean and Vice Deans of the Faculty of Languages, the Dean and Vice Deans of the Faculty of Sport Sciences, assistant deans, and several faculty members. Dr. Fatima Khreisat, the project liaison and Assistant Dean for Student and Graduate Affairs, stated that the platform represented a national hub

School of Archaeology and Tourism

- Throughout the academic year, the "My History, My Identity" Committee-comprising Dr. Mona Sleihat, Dr. Aseel Al-Ajlouni, Dr. Moath Al-Fuqaha, and Mr. Tariq Mehairat—executed the first phase of the "My History, My Identity" initiative at the School of Archaeology and Tourism. The program invited public and private school students from the University District to visit the university's Museum of Jordanian Heritage and the Museum of Popular Traditions. A total of 224 students participated during the first and second semesters, guided by the museum curators and ten student representatives from the "Friends of Museums" Committee. These tours provided students with insights into pivotal eras of Jordan's history and significant archaeological and heritage artifacts. This initiative achieved a high effectiveness rating, successfully reinforcing the School's educational and national mission while fostering a deep sense of national identity among the students.
- Jordan Independence Day Celebration at the Royal Tank Museum. On May 25, 2025, the School of Archaeology and Tourism at the University of Jordan actively participated in organizing the national celebration for Jordan's 79th Independence Day at the Royal Tank Museum. Under the supervision of Dr. Mona Sleihat and the Curator of the Museum of Popular Traditions, Mr. Tariq Mehairat, 34 male and female students from the College served as volunteers to facilitate the event for the local community. This collaboration aimed to foster a culture of volunteerism and community leadership among students while engaging them in significant national festivities. The students' contributions were integral to the success of the event, which featured military performances, cultural

exhibitions, and interactive activities, drawing a large public turnout. This activity underscores the School's commitment to patriotic duty and its role in developing the professional and social competencies of its students through real-world heritage and community engagement.

- The Department of Archaeology organized an event titled “Archaeology Science Activity: The Past Mirrors the Present” on 18 May 2025, involving university staff including Sabah, Lubna, Saed, Akram, Muath Al-Fuqaha, and Muhannad Tantawi, along with 20 college students. University participants included the Dean, faculty members, staff, and students, while community participants included 20 orphan children hosted on campus, members of the Um Al-Jamal Association for Heritage Preservation, local traditional craftsmen (Ms. Hanadi Al-Yazouri and Mr. Habis Thalji), and representatives from the American Center for Oriental Research (ACOR). The event featured workshops and exhibitions of various traditional Jordanian crafts organized by the Um Al-Jamal Association, a stone tool-making workshop supervised by Dr. Mayson Al-Nahar, a mosaic-making workshop supervised by Ms. Hanadi Al-Yazouri, and a pottery-making workshop supervised by Mr. Habis Thalji. An interactive play titled “The Fossil and the Genie” addressed narcissistic personality disorder and its impact on society, attended by a group of orphan children who also participated in handicraft activities, museum visits, and a series of entertainment sessions tailored for them. Additionally, heritage books and stories were presented through the American Center for Oriental Research, the Rabatani Center, as well as French and German cultural centers.

- The University of Jordan, represented by Vice Dean Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, organized an event for the local community on 18 May 2025 in celebration of International Museum Day at the Royal Tank Museum. University participants included Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, three “Friends of Museums” students (Zeinab, Amer, and Mai), and museum staff member Tareq Mahirat, alongside a group of college students. The College participated through its Archaeology and Folklore Museum and curator Tareq Mahirat, assisting in organizing the event. Activities included a Bedouin tent corner, a “Try My Heritage” corner, and visitor video presentations about the Archaeology and Folklore Museum. The event also featured cultural and heritage activities aimed at highlighting the importance of museums in preserving history and promoting national identity. This participation emphasized the integration of cultural institutions and museums in strengthening the role of heritage and culture as active elements in building contemporary communities, fostering national identity, and encouraging knowledge exchange in collaboration with the Royal Tank Museum.

- The University of Jordan, led by Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, organized the “Environmental Journey” initiative for university students, school students, and local community members from targeted areas such as Al-Nawatef, aiming to raise environmental awareness and promote sustainable practices. University participants included 12 students from the Department of Tourism Management, in collaboration with Dr. Mona Al-Salehat and Dr. Lama Al-‘Areenat. Community partners included the Middle East Center for Empowering Initiatives, represented by Mr. Faisal Abu Al-Sundus, and Dr. Joan Abini, Chair of Land and Environmental Management at the Prince Hassan bin Talal Faculty of Natural Resources and Environment, Al-Hussein University. The initiative included three main activities: an environmental journey to Wadi Namira on 10 August 2024 and a second journey to Al-Nawatef on 30 November 2024, both designed to enhance environmental awareness, sustainable tourism, and students’ personal and professional skills. Students engaged in hands-on learning activities, including site exploration, documentation of flora and fauna, risk assessment, and proposing practical solutions to environmental challenges. Additionally, a training workshop on “Designing Sustainable Initiatives” was held on 18–19 February 2025, conducted by Mr. Faisal Abu Al-Sundus, aiming to train students in developing sustainable and community-based initiatives. Activity 4: On Thursday, 21 January 2025, the “Environmental Journey” student team delivered a presentation showcasing the results of their visit to the Al-Nawatef area in Tafila. The presentation, attended by Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, Head of the Department and initiative supervisor, Mr. Faisal Abu Al-Sundus, Director of the Middle East Center for Empowering Initiatives, and Dr. Joan Abini, Chair of Land and Environmental Management at the Prince Hassan bin Talal Faculty of Natural Resources and Environment, Al-Hussein University, provided a comprehensive overview of the area’s natural characteristics and unique geographical location, highlighting its rich biodiversity. The team presented a SWOT analysis to evaluate the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and challenges of the area, discussed key environmental and human-related challenges, and proposed sustainable solutions to support development, alongside environmental and tourism activities aimed at protecting the area. Activity 5: On 13 April 2025, an exploratory campus tour was conducted at the University of Jordan to study the university environment and contribute to designing an eco-friendly natural path suitable for student use, creating a sustainable educational and recreational space for the entire university community. Activity 6: On 13 May 2025, an 800-meter educational natural trail was designed specifically for school students, starting from the Archaeology and Folklore Museum and ending at the University Staff Club Garden. The trail aimed to enhance students’ environmental and cultural awareness through interactive heritage and cultural activities, including storytelling stations, “Knowledge Treasure” contests,

traditional food corners, nature drawing, and visits to the museums, providing an engaging and experiential educational experience.

- The University of Jordan, represented by Vice Dean Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, organized the “Friends of Museums Team Formation” initiative on 18 February 2025, targeting 20 college students. University participants included 18 students, Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, Dr. Muath Al-Fuqaha, Archaeology Museum curator, and Mr. Tareq Mahirat, Folklore Museum curator. Community participants included representatives from the Royal Tank Museum. The initiative consisted of a training program for the “Friends of Museums” student team held at the Royal Tank Museum, conducted by the museum curators from the Archaeology and Folklore Museums at the College of Archaeology and Tourism. The program aimed to enhance students’ sense of community responsibility, national belonging, and promote the values of patriotism and heritage preservation among community members through participation in community-based initiatives. Two student teams were formed: the first team consisting of 8 students, and the second team of 10 students.
- The College of Archaeology and Tourism, represented by the Folklore Museum, participated in the Independence Day celebration held at Um Al-Qura Mixed Basic School in Wadi Al-Seer on 19 May 2025. The university participants included Mr. Tareq Mahirat, Curator of the Folklore Museum, and “Friends of Museums” students Mai Al-Sabbagh and Amer Al-Nayef. Community participants included students of Um Al-Qura Mixed Basic School, under the patronage of the Director of Education for the Wadi Al-Seer District, Mrs. Sawsan Al-Ajarmeh, along with several educational and administrative staff members. The Folklore Museum presented a distinguished exhibition showcasing the museum’s collections that highlight the essence of authentic Jordanian heritage, contributing to the promotion of national identity and cultural values among students, and strengthening community engagement on the occasion of Independence Day. The college students also played an active role in organizing the Folklore Museum’s exhibition booth, demonstrating dedication and national pride that reflect a deep sense of belonging and appreciation for Jordanian heritage.

- The Folklore Museum participated in the “Tent of Pride” event held from 23 to 27 April 2025 as part of the “Bil Arabi” Festival at the Children’s Museum. The participation was organized by Dr. Mona Al-Salehat and included Mr. Tareq Mahirat and five “Friends of Museums” students — Mai Al-Sabbagh, Roqaya Domra, Sandy, Rannad Za’atreh, and Ma’ab. The event attracted members of the local community and visitors of the Children’s Museum. The Folklore Museum presented a distinctive display of traditional artifacts that reflect various aspects of Jordan’s rich history. The participation aimed to raise children’s and visitors’ awareness of Jordanian culture and heritage through showcasing everyday tools and objects used in the past, explaining their stories and social significance. This provided an engaging educational experience that helped instill in children an appreciation of heritage and pride in their national identity.

- The Department of Tourism Management, represented by Dr. Mona Al-Salehat, organized the “Tourism for All” – Sign Language Initiative on 23 November 2024, targeting students with hearing and speech impairments from the University of Jordan. University participants included Dr. Mona Al-Salehat and sign language interpreters Ms. Jumana Al-Sheikh and Ms. Rania Ali from the Deanship of Student Affairs. Community participants included Saqr Jordan Travel and Tourism Company, represented by Mr. Hossam Al-Haj Eid, Director of Domestic and International Tourism, along with tour guide Mr. Ahmad Abu Zahra from the Ministry of Tourism and Antiquities and assistant tour guide Ms. Tala Al-Tamimi from Al-Hashemite University. The activity included accessible tourism trips for students with special needs (hearing and speech impairments) to Jerash and Ajloun. The initiative aimed to promote inclusivity and provide tourism opportunities for all segments of society, with activities and programs designed to meet the needs of students with disabilities. Sign language interpreters and professional guides were provided to ensure effective communication and a rich, engaging experience for participants. The initiative highlighted the importance of integrating people with disabilities into tourism activities, promoting the values of inclusion and equality, and empowering them to enjoy meaningful cultural and heritage experiences that connect them with Jordan’s diverse touristic and archaeological sites.

- A cultural awareness panel discussion titled “Archaeological Heritage in Algeria and Jordan: Diversity and Richness” was organized by Dr. Mayson Al-Nahar on 11 October 2024 as part of the 23rd Amman International Book Fair. The session was attended by members of the general public, cultural heritage enthusiasts from Jordan and Algeria, as

School of Law

- July 21, 2024

Dr. Ahmed Qabbabeh, Assistant Professor of Public International Law and Chair of the Public Law Department at the Faculty of Law, University of Jordan, represented the faculty at the annual meeting of Public International Law professors organized by the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC). The meeting focused on promoting international humanitarian law (IHL) and global humanitarian principles in Jordanian law schools and addressing current challenges in applying and enforcing IHL. During his intervention, Dr. Qabbabeh emphasized the legal obligation of states under the 1949 Geneva Conventions, the importance of including IHL in civil and military education, and the need to educate university students as future implementers of IHL (e.g., judges, doctors, media professionals, and military officers). He highlighted the role of IHL in

protecting victims of armed conflicts and regulating warfare, while noting challenges such as non-compliance by parties to conflicts, insufficient international mechanisms for accountability, and rising humanitarian harm in current conflicts. The meeting also addressed the ICRC's role in promoting IHL and concluded with the decision to organize a research competition for law students on contemporary IHL issues, supported and supervised by the ICRC, to be officially announced soon.



- July 12, 2024

The Faculty of Law at the University of Jordan participated in the 2024 Francophone University Agency Moot Competition for the Middle East, focusing on the rights of marginalized groups, particularly persons with disabilities. Organized by the Francophone University Agency in collaboration with the UN Human Rights Training and Documentation Centre, the Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs, and the University of Jordan, the competition aimed to enhance access to justice for vulnerable groups through university legal clinics. It consisted of two phases: drafting a national law to protect persons with disabilities, and conducting mock trials over three days (July 9–11, 2024) with 11 teams from universities in Iraq, Palestine, Jordan, Egypt, and Lebanon. The team, supervised by Dr. Ghufran Hilal and trained by Shaimaa Al-Qurashi, included students Dana Al-Masri, Hazem Shahhi, Bisan Al-Shalalfa, Hala Al-Nahwi, Najati Amro, Mohammad Al-Akhras, Sara Al-Awamleh, Joud Qabbabeh, and Tasneem Al-Ajouri, with Dana Al-Masri, Hazem Shahhi, and Bisan Al-Shalalfa advancing to the second phase.

The Dean of the Faculty of Law at the University of Jordan, Prof. Dr. Bassem Malham, received Dr. Jean-Noël Baléo, Director of the Middle East Regional Office of the Agence Universitaire de la Francophonie (AUF), and his deputy Cynthia Raad on February 8, 2024, to discuss strengthening academic and extracurricular cooperation between the faculty and the AUF for the benefit of faculty members and students. The meeting, attended by Dr. Ghufran Hilal, Assistant Dean for Student Affairs and supervisor of the AUF project at the faculty, Dr. Ismail Al-Hadidi, Head of the Private Law Department, and Dr. Amal Khalifa, coordinator of cooperation between the university and the AUF, highlighted the importance of developing the faculty's legal clinic and supporting related activities such as research competitions for law students on human rights, sustainable development goals, and the rights of persons with disabilities, while enhancing students' practical and professional skills. The delegation also met with students participating in a research competition who presented their work on drafting a proposed law on the rights of persons with disabilities that aligns national legislation with international agreements, and the visit concluded with a tour of the faculty's facilities.

The University of Jordan participated in the 33rd Arab Music Festival and Conference in Cairo, Egypt, organized by the Egyptian Ministry of Culture and the Cairo Opera House, focusing on "Artificial Intelligence at the Core of Arab Musical Dialogue." Three faculty

members from the Department of Music, Faculty of Arts and Design, represented the university: Prof. Rami Haddad, Vice Dean, presented on “Academic Experiences in Arab Musical Performance and Their Role in Developing Contemporary Musical Creativity Standards,” highlighting applied curricula in higher education and linking Arab musical traditions with modern academic techniques; Prof. Nidal Nseirat presented a descriptive-analytical study on “The Impact of Technological Development and AI on Music Education,” examining AI tools such as smart simulations and virtual interactions and their effect on academic musical performance in the Arab world; and Dr. Mohammad Wasf, Head of the Department of Music, discussed “Future Challenges for the Arab Composer amid Rapid AI Developments,” addressing creative and legal challenges posed by AI-generated composition, emphasizing the need for an Arab vision that preserves the authenticity of Arab melodies while comparing AI-generated samples with human-composed ones.

The participation underscored the University of Jordan’s pioneering role in academic music research and engagement with digital developments in composition, performance, and education. The conference highlighted four main themes: the future of Arab music in the AI era, music education in light of technological advances, documentation from the 1932 conference to the digital revolution, and production challenges (composition, arrangement, performance) amid digital transformation. It also raised critical questions about AI’s ability to capture emotion, improvisation, and the spirit of Arab music, ethical and legal concerns regarding synthetic voices and AI-generated compositions, and how to integrate AI in teaching and composition without losing Arab music’s identity. Through this engagement, the University of Jordan reaffirmed its commitment to advancing academic research, fostering innovation, and promoting Arab musical heritage in the digital era.

In line with Her Majesty Queen Rania's vision of promoting sustainability and environmental awareness among youth, the University of Jordan, represented by the Faculty of Arts and Design, launched an innovative artistic initiative titled "Recycling as a Tool for Environmental Awareness", led by Dr. Haifa Bani Ismail. The project allowed students to transform old furniture and discarded wood into contemporary art pieces that combine aesthetic design with sustainability values. Under the supervision of the Faculty, students in the "Workshop Practices" course revived chairs, tables, and other items, turning them into artworks that communicate both history and modernity, highlighting the power of art to drive positive change. The initiative, praised by the Dean, Dr. Jihad Al-Amri, reflects the students' ability to see beauty in old materials and aligns with the university's mission to serve the community while promoting environmental responsibility. The project was implemented in four stages, including transforming old furniture into art for the exhibition "From Waste to Value", refurbishing university corridors and meeting rooms, and producing around 40 artworks using recycled wood and metal for university walls and halls. Notable student works included a wooden mural by Jana Haidar combining craftsmanship with AI, and a geometric wall panel by Dania Al-Rfou incorporating traditional motifs with modern colors, both reflecting environmental awareness and creativity. Beyond art, the initiative served as an educational platform, enhancing students' understanding of sustainability, environmental responsibility, and the integration of creativity with ecological and social values, embodying a practical translation of the Queen's vision into a future-conscious, culturally vibrant, and environmentally aware generation.

Launch of the Graphic Novel “From a Refugee’s Memory” in Zarqa Camp Dr. Amal Khalifa, professor and researcher in the Department of French Language and Literature at the University of Jordan, organized the launch of the graphic novel “From a Refugee’s Memory” in Zarqa Camp, supported by the French Institute of the Near East (Ifpo) and the European project ITHACA Horizon 2020, in collaboration with the Zarqa Camp Services Improvement Committee. The event gathered a notable audience of academics, students, cultural and Palestinian affairs enthusiasts, alongside the project team. Participants included the artist Imad Hajaj, illustrator Khaled Nahar, and Palestinian refugee Abu Iyad Al-Buriji, whose testimony formed the core of this research-art project. Student Shahd Al-Ghazzawi shared her experience translating the story into French. The program included a discussion session highlighting the integration of academic research and artistic creativity as a tool to convey

live testimonies, preserve collective memory, and raise awareness about refugees' lives and community initiatives. The event also featured an exhibition of selected panels from the story, curated by comic artist Mike F. Dirdrian. The graphic novel was published by Dar Al-Ahlia for Publishing and Distribution in Amman and translated collaboratively into French by Shahd Al-Ghazzawi, Dr. Simon Dubois, and Dr. Amal Khalifa. "From a Refugee's Memory" documents the testimony of Abu Iyad Al-Buriji, a resident of Zarqa Camp who launched an initiative to name a street near the camp after his displaced Palestinian village Al-Burij, southwest of Jerusalem. The story aims to preserve Palestinian memory, transmit it to future generations, assert refugees' right of return, and affirm Palestinians' enduring existence in Palestine, countering efforts to erase history. The project highlights refugees' resilience and emphasizes the importance of oral history and storytelling in safeguarding identity and resisting oblivion.

Student Zeina Al-Najjar Represents the University of Jordan as an Ambassador Zeina Al-Najjar, a Jordanian student, received an Erasmus scholarship from the University of Jordan to study Spanish at the University of Almería in Spain. Her experience went beyond academic learning, becoming a rich humanitarian and cultural journey that reflected positively on the University of Jordan and its students, serving as an exemplary model for those given opportunities to excel. During her time in Spain, Zeina volunteered at the Spanish

Association Against Cancer, one of the largest organizations raising awareness about the disease and providing patient support. She contributed as a translator for Arabic-speaking cancer patients, assisting them during medical visits to ensure they received proper care and understood medical procedures. Zeina also participated in educational programs for school students, raising awareness about the dangers of electronic smoking and its severe health risks, including cancer. Additionally, she joined a psychosocial support initiative for cancer patients, taking part in a two-day trip to a rural home that included interactive activities and documenting interviews to capture patients' experiences and triumphs. Her efforts drew attention from local Spanish media, leading the newspaper *El Voz de Almería* to interview her and publish an article about her journey as a Jordanian student in Spain. In the article, Zeina highlighted the talent and high cultural awareness of Jordanian youth, stating: "Jordanian youth do not lack ambition or competence; they only need a real opportunity to prove themselves." Furthermore, Zeina was a pioneer in Arabic-Spanish cultural exchange programs, teaching Arabic to interested Spanish students. Through this initiative, she built meaningful relationships and friendships that fostered cultural openness and intercultural dialogue among young people from different nationalities.

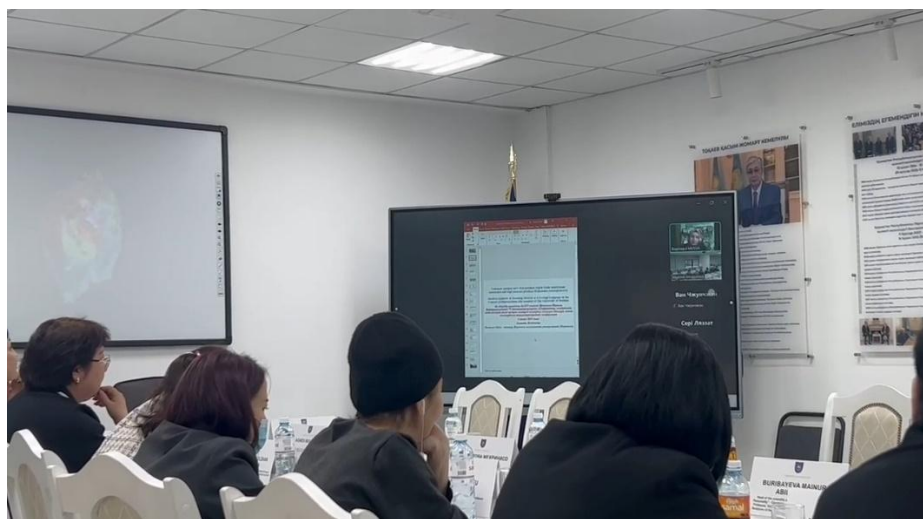

The University of Jordan Shines Globally in the English Language Olympiad for Universities. The University of Jordan achieved a remarkable global accomplishment by securing second place in the English language test at the Global English Language Olympiad for Universities, while its team, “Arabian Oryx”, ranked fifth globally in the same competition, which was held for the first time in Jordan under the theme “National Heritage.” The university team included Diana Abdo, Maya Al-Jadaan, Menna Allah Al-Najjar, Fares

Yacoub, and Rami Al-Shara, under the supervision of Dr. Doaa Salameh. The team's diverse academic backgrounds contributed to effective teamwork and an outstanding performance, showcasing their advanced English language skills. The Olympiad aimed to enhance students' English proficiency using modern methods, develop leadership and entrepreneurial skills, strengthen teamwork, and link these abilities to community service and academic research. It provided students with an opportunity to think creatively and go beyond conventional approaches, offering a unique learning experience that reflected the university's role as a representative of its community internationally. The Olympiad hosted 57 teams from 24 Jordanian higher education institutions, alongside teams from Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Palestine, and Bahrain, giving the competition a truly international dimension. This achievement underscores the University of Jordan's excellence and academic leadership at both local and global levels. The event marked the first global English Language Olympiad for Universities hosted in Jordan, highlighting the country's educational and cultural prestige. The Olympiad spanned three days and included five main tracks: theatrical performance, project presentation, English language test, community service, and teamwork. The launch of the Olympiad was attended by Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research Dr. Azmi Mahafzah, Secretary-General of the Ministry and Chair of the Supreme Council for the Olympiad Dr. Mamoun Al-Debei, alongside presidents of public and private universities in Jordan, and Arab cultural attachés and advisors in Amman.

Visit to the Language Institute of the Jordanian Armed Forces A delegation from the Faculty of Foreign Languages, led by Dean Dr. Marwan Al-Jarrah, visited the Language Institute of the Jordanian Armed Forces in Zarqa. The delegation included Vice Dean for Academic Affairs and Graduate Studies Dr. Yazid Al-Hamouri, Chair of the Department of English Language and Literature Dr. Hussein Al-Hawamdeh, and faculty member of the Department of Asian Languages Dr. Ali Bani Ali. 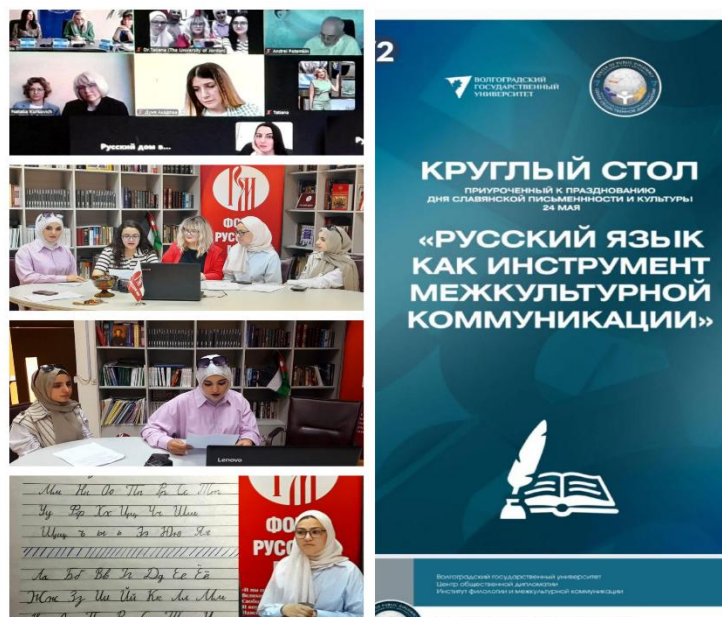
delegation toured the Faculty of Foreign Languages, the Language Center, and the Translation Center, where they were introduced to modern teaching tools, laboratories, and other facilities.

The conference was dedicated to celebrating the Day of Slavic Writing and Culture, observed worldwide on May 24 each year. The celebration traces back to Saints Cyril and Methodius, who created the Cyrillic alphabet in 863, now used by Slavic nations including Russia, Serbia, Croatia, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, Bulgaria, Belarus, and Ukraine. The University of Jordan organized a local workshop in Aqaba as part of the EU-funded PROMPT project, bringing together key stakeholders, researchers, and environmental experts to present and discuss the project outcomes on operational monitoring readiness and pollutant transport prediction in the marine environment. The workshop was opened by Professor Riyad Manasrah from the Department of Physics and project coordinator, who emphasized the university’s commitment to environmental research and regional cooperation in addressing marine pollution challenges. Participants attended a technical presentation by Professor Mohammad Rasheed from the Department of Chemistry on the impacts of oil and chemical

spills in seas and the importance of predictive tools and decision-support systems. This was followed by a two-part session led by Professor Manasrah, showcasing the scientific findings and key outputs of the PROMPT project, including a demonstration of the decision-support system's capabilities such as real-time simulations, risk assessment tools, and satellite-based leak detection. The workshop concluded with an interactive discussion on future collaboration and practical implementation of the project's tools, reaffirming the University of Jordan's leading role in promoting scientific innovation and environmental sustainability in the Mediterranean region.

Dina Al-Wuheidi, a senior undergraduate student in the Department of Physics at the University of Jordan, participated in the 13th NYUAD QC and AI Hackathon as part of Team 4, "Water Wizards." The team proposed an innovative solution using quantum optimization to determine the optimal placement of quantum sensors in water reservoir networks, aiming to enable early detection of heavy metal contamination. The team consisted of 11 members from around the world and was mentored by Ben Hall from Inflection and Nouhaila Innan from eBrain Lab – CQTS, who provided guidance and support throughout all stages of the project. This participation highlights the student's excellence and reflects the university's commitment to fostering innovation and global engagement in advanced scientific fields.

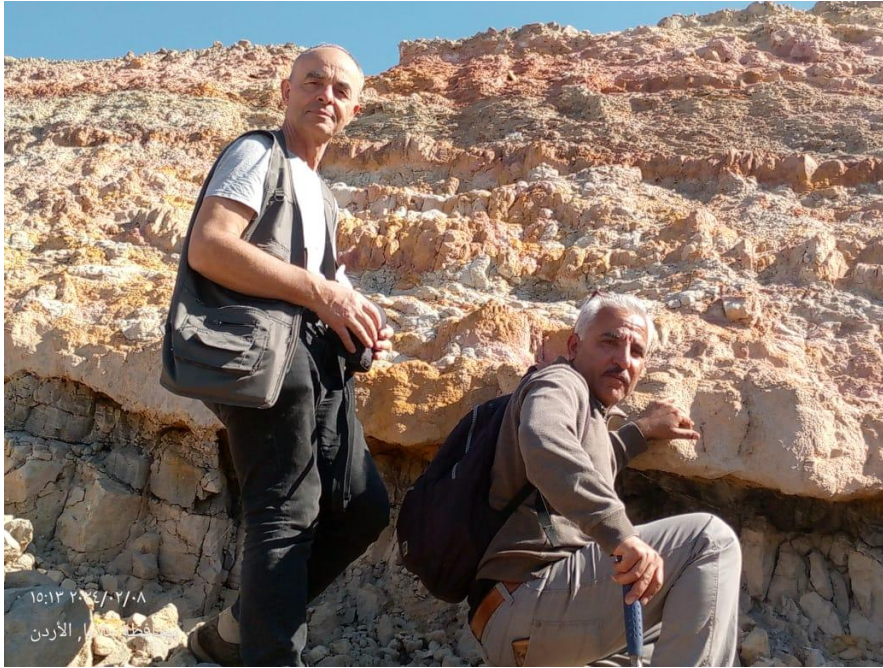

The Department of Geology at the University of Jordan hosted Professor Alfred Uchman from the Department of Geography and Geology at Jagiellonian University in Kraków, Poland, as part of the Erasmus+ program, aiming to strengthen and renew academic and research collaboration. As a specialist in ichnology—the study of trace fossils in sedimentary rocks—Professor Uchman contributed valuable expertise in interpreting ancient environments and past ecosystems. The visit, organized in cooperation with Professor Abdullah Abu Hammad and with the participation of Dr. Habis Al-Masha'qbeh from Al al-Bayt University, included several field trips to key geological sites in Jordan. These visits covered limestone quarries in Wadi Al-Seer, where trace fossils such as *Thalassinoides* were observed, as well as Lower Triassic deposits along the western coast of the Dead Sea, which provided insights into ecosystem recovery after the Permian–Triassic mass extinction. Figure 2 shows crawling traces on sediment surfaces produced by small invertebrates, preserved as casts in Lower Triassic sandstone deposits of the Ma'in Formation in Wadi Al-Dardour. The data collected during the visit is expected to support future joint research and publications, marking an important step toward expanding scientific cooperation between Jordanian and Polish geologists.

School of Agriculture

- May 19,2025

As part of the Functional Training Program for agriculture students, the Departments of Horticulture & Crops and Plant Protection at the University of Jordan organized a comprehensive visit to Syngenta's Knowledge Center for Crop Protection Products. The visit aimed to provide students with practical, hands-on experience and to strengthen the collaboration between the university and the global agricultural sector. Students specializing in Horticulture & Crops, under the supervision of their instructors, explored the station dedicated to evaluating and selecting vegetable seed varieties, learning about the criteria for developing competitive crops suitable for the local market. They engaged actively with the staff, asking questions and discussing key aspects of seed quality and evaluation. Meanwhile, Plant Protection students participated in practical training on the fundamentals of crop protection, including the factors affecting spraying efficiency, proper selection of spraying equipment, correct calibration, and field application techniques. The students applied their knowledge directly in the field, receiving guidance from the technical team at Syngenta. The visit concluded with an interactive assessment, where students demonstrated their understanding and skills, and the top three performers were awarded symbolic prizes in recognition of their excellence and engagement throughout the training.

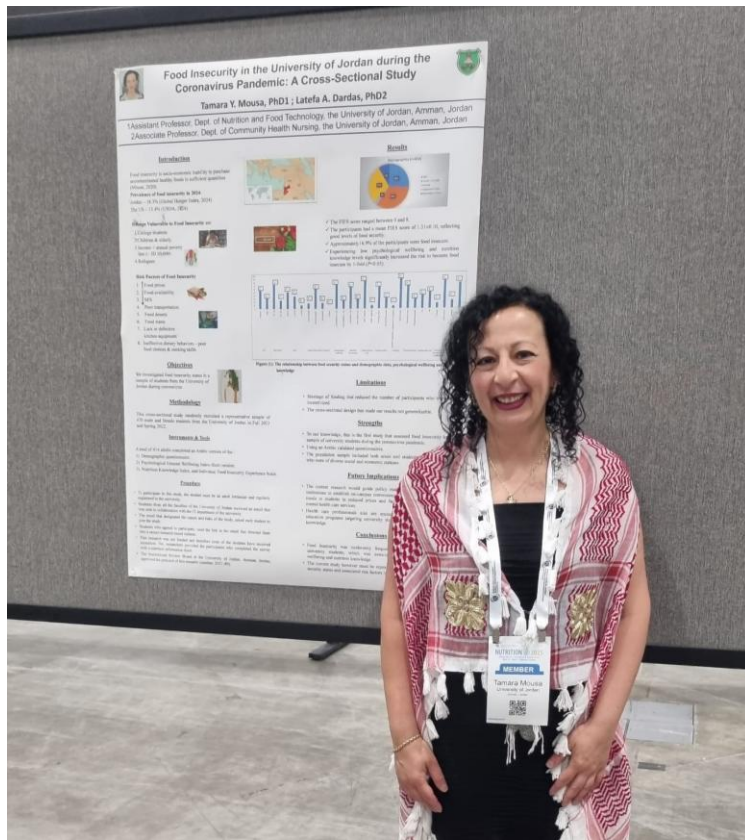

Food Science and Technology bachelor's students completed their internship in the Department of Nutrition and Food Processing under the supervision of Dr. Ghadeer Mihyar and Eng. Nour Quteishat, during which they developed a range of functional food products. The training covered production, packaging, and preparation of nutrition labels, as well as chemical, microbial, and sensory analyses to ensure product quality and safety. The results demonstrated successful production, and the products received positive evaluations from tasters. The developed products included gluten-free cupcakes, strawberry jam with chia seeds, dried fruits and vegetables, oat milk pudding, labneh enriched with flavored fats (thyme, chili, and basil), and fruit yogurt (strawberry and mango).

Professor Nidaa Salem from the University of Jordan participated as a keynote speaker in the Morocco Tomato Conference, where she delivered a presentation titled “Tomato Brown Rugose Fruit Virus: Current Status and Future Prospects.” Her talk covered the discovery of the virus, its distribution and epidemiology, host range, symptoms, transmission methods, genomic structure and variability, virus–host interactions, detection techniques, and management strategies, in addition to highlighting challenges facing agricultural companies and farmers and discussing recent scientific developments to limit its spread. The conference was attended by hundreds of participants from various countries, and the presentation received significant recognition due to its focus on a disease that threatens tomato production worldwide. It is also noteworthy that Dr. Salem, along with other scientists, recently published a review paper on this topic in the journal *Annual Review of Phytopathology*.

Students enrolled in the Poultry Farm Management course in the Department of Animal Production at the Faculty of Agriculture conducted a scientific field visit to Alestesharia Animal Nutrition, a leading company locally and regionally in manufacturing feed additives and formulating feed mixtures for farm animals. The visit was coordinated by Professor Hanaa Zakaria, where students toured the premix production facilities accompanied by Executive Director Eng. Ihsan Masharbah and Technical Director Eng. Rand Masharbah. During the tour, they learned about the methods used in preparing feed additives, production lines, and the systems and programs applied in formulating feed rations, particularly for poultry. The visit concluded with students expressing appreciation for the company's hospitality and the valuable knowledge and practical insights gained from the experience.

Staff members from the Faculty of Agriculture at the University of Jordan participated in a workshop held at the University of Twente in the Netherlands as part of the Nexus Watch project, which focuses on using environmental monitoring techniques and geographic information technology to strengthen the water–food–energy nexus and is supported by the Dutch organization for internationalization in education. The workshop covered topics related to land-use modeling and changes, remote sensing, vegetation monitoring, smart agriculture principles, and the use of drones in agriculture, in addition to field visits to laboratories and practical applications and a meeting with the Jordanian ambassador in the Netherlands. The project aims to enhance the skills and knowledge of specialists and partner institutions in priority areas through a sustainable development approach, with participation from several local and international partners. The Faculty of Agriculture was represented by faculty members, laboratory supervisors, and graduate students from various departments, whose participation contributed to strengthening expertise and fostering collaboration in advanced agricultural technologies.

Students from the Department of Animal Production at the Faculty of Agriculture participated in a scientific field visit to “Al-Youm” and “Maurice Al-Naber” dairy farms as part of the “Dairy Farm Management” course, organized by Professor Mufid Al-Nimr. The first visit was to Al-Youm Farm in Al-Hallabat, one of the largest dairy cattle projects in Jordan, housing approximately 4,000 head of cattle, where Farm Manager Eng. Imad Bakr provided a comprehensive explanation and engaged students in discussions that enriched their understanding of dairy farm operations, including various housing systems and the automated milking parlor. The second visit took place at Maurice Al-Naber Farm in Al-Dhuleil, where students held informative discussions with Farm Manager Adnan Aqneibi about managing a medium-sized dairy farm and the challenges facing the sector. The visit provided students with practical insight into dairy cattle production in Jordan, and they concluded by expressing appreciation to both farms for the opportunity to learn about real-world practices and challenges in the industry.

Students of Animal Production at the Faculty of Agriculture participated in a scientific field visit to Jana Al-Khairat Dairy Farm, organized by Dr. Mohammad Al-Qaisi as part of the “Dairy Cattle Production” course, with the aim of linking academic knowledge to practical dairy farming operations in Jordan. During the visit, Farm Manager Hashem Salameh and veterinarian Ahmad Moussa guided students through various farm sections, explaining calf care from birth to weaning, post-weaning management, and challenges faced during critical growth stages. Students also explored dairy cow barns, feed storage facilities, and ration preparation, including the Total Mixed Ration (TMR) system, and observed the automated milking parlor with a detailed explanation of milking procedures. The visit included observing a live calving case and learning about protocols for handling births and assessing colostrum quality using a refractometer. The visit concluded with students expressing appreciation for the opportunity, valuable practical insights, and the farm staff’s cooperation and hospitality.
